CLUNES NEIGHBOURHOOD HOUSE NEWS!

There is something about a new year that always feels optimistic, but in 2023 for Clunes Neighbourhood House, the coming months really do bring excitement. On Sunday, 19th February we will be officially opening the doors to our new and permanent home at the Clunes Free Lending Library with a public, family friendly event for all. This move is exciting on so many fronts.

It will be the first time since Clunes Neighbourhood House was founded in 1982 that we have had a permanent home. A house we can invest in, knowing that we have the rights and capacity to remain there indefinitely. In fact, the land agreement says "in perpetuity" providing we show the building the love and care it warrants.

Thanks to the Efforts of Others

Ironically, it's the love and care shown by so many in the past that has made this move possible. The work and persistence of community members such as Reg Kinnersley, Graeme Johnston, Phil Taig, Denise Fordham, Victoria Reeve, Tom Binns and many others meant that the Free Lending Library (while still in need of work) is in sufficient working order to safely house Clunes Neighbourhood House. The opportunity for Clunes Neighbourhood House to further contribute to the restoration of such a treasured community building is an honour, and not possible without all the work that has gone before us.

What Will Happen in the House?

The patterns of the past are an interesting thing. How many times have you observed that what once occurred somewhere, returns eventually? Clunes
Neighbourhood House will be opening the Free
Lending Library three days a week – Tuesday to
Thursday, 9.30am til 2pm. The facilities mean that
we'll be able to offer learn local options as well as
social activities, something we haven't been able to do
in the past. These classes (subject streams include Life
Hacks, Health and Wellbeing and Just for Fun) will be
an echo of the learning that once took place in the Free
Lending Library (then the Mechanics Institute) when it
first opened its doors in 1872. These activities will
complement the other programs, such as free exercise
classes and Open House meals that we deliver. They

will also complement the enabled initiatives we underpin through the Clunes Men's Shed and Attitude: Ageing Well in Clunes.

In addition to these activities we are looking to make laundry and shower facilities available to people who don't have access to functional facilities; provide public access computers and a place to have a cup of tea and a chat.

What About Facilities at 70 Bailey Street?

When Clunes Neighbourhood House moves into the Free Lending Library it will continue to be a sub-tenant and partner of the Lee Medlyn Home of Bottles. Over the past 8 years we have invested considerably in the development of the playground, grounds and facilities at the 70 Bailey Street site. It now includes an improved playground, garden beds, a Lunchroom venue for event hire, refurbished tram for hire that is perfect for birthday parties or gatherings, and storage facilities (originally office facilities but permitting requirements mean there use is now limited). Food is Free stall will remain in this space where it is easily accessible to all.

We will continue to maintain these facilities and are in discussions with several community groups about revitalised use of the garden beds.


